Demonstrated at least a ninth-grade (9th) proficiency on tests of reading, written expression, and mathematics by March 15 of senior year. 3. Attended Hawaiian Mission Academy for at least the one full year of his/her senior year. 4. Demonstrated satisfactory citizenship and punctual attendance. 5. Paid in full any account owed to the academy. 6. Earned the required credits in each subject area [see above chart]. 7. Has earned 25 clock hours of Community Service for <u>each</u> year at HMA. 8. Has completed 100 hours of Work Experience before May 1 of senior year (excluding International Students). 	<p>Students will receive a College PREP designation if the following additional requirements are met beyond the General Academic requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 30 units of Science which must include Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. • 20 units of the same Foreign Language. • 30 units of Math which must include Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II. • Maintain a minimum “C” grade in <u>each</u> course • 10th grade proficiency in Math & English skills.

NOTE: Other elective courses may be offered. All students pursuing a College PREP diploma must maintain a minimum “C” grade in each course. Also all students taking the honors courses must maintain a “C” grade or above, otherwise they will be dropped from the honors course and be placed in the regular course.
